

**Berlin Calling: The journey of a second-generation  
Holocaust survivor's search to uncover her father's story  
to screen at the Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust**

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE (May 12, 2014): The independent documentary "Berlin Calling," will screen at the Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust on June 19, 2014.

Coming straight off its world premiere and win of a Gold Remi Award at World-Fest Houston International Film Festival in April, "Berlin Calling" follows Los Angeles resident, Kastle Waserman, a second-generation Holocaust survivor and journalist, on a journey to uncover her father's story.

When she was a child in suburban Houston, her father never talked about his past. However, little signs began to appear as she entered her teens. Her rebellious love of punk rock brought forth some of her father's deepest fears of persecution and being marked as "different."

As an adult, she began to use her investigative journalism skills to chronicle her father's past and bear witness as her father answers the hard questions about what happened to him in Berlin as a Jewish child under Nazi oppression. Interspersed with her father's detailed descriptions of his time in a concentration camp and historical context of the dawn of WWII, the film travels alongside our main character as her research takes her across the globe from Los Angeles and Houston to Berlin, Prague and Paris. She opens the very paperwork the Nazis kept on her family, and has a surprising revelation - the fate of a family member who disappeared in the early days of persecution.

"Berlin Calling" was produced and directed by award winning, British born, filmmaker Nigel Dick, who has been responsible for some of the most influential videos in music history including Guns n' Roses' "Welcome to the Jungle," Oasis' "Wonderwall" and Britney Spears' "Baby One More Time."
